Let's talk: Terminology

Within Mobility Online the most frequently used terms are Registration, Application, Proposal and Nomination. But what is what? And how to keep them straight?



Registration: Each activity that a student wants to carry out, has to be registered within Mobility Online. There are 4 different types of registrations at the University of Twente: (1) internships, (2) graduation (standard / extended), (3) courses abroad and (4) other activities. One student can have multiple registrations; e.g. one for internships and one for graduation.

Application: A registered activity is called an application as it moves through the pipeline(s).

Proposal: The content of the activity is referred to as the proposal. For courses the content is recorded in the course list, for an internship and graduation the content is recorded in the proposal form.

Nomination: If you register a student at a partner institution for a semester (or longer), this is referred to as *nomination*. The other way around, a host institution can also nominate

students to come here at the University of Twente.
