## COORDINATED VULNERABILITY DISCLOSURE POLICY

This [new policy](#) should help researchers and students guide them through the steps that need to be taken when discovering a (software) vulnerability. The UC advised to clearly indicate to whom and when this policy applies, because for faculties that have little to do with IT or cyber security, the policy is not that straightforward. The UC suggested to add a preamble, more clarifying examples, and a decision scheme. The UC also [advised](#) to emphasize the help structure that is available for the researcher when needed, such that the impression of a great additional workload gets nuanced.

## EVALUATION LOWERED TUITION FEE FOR TEMPORARY PROTECTION & ASYLUM SEEKING STUDENTS

Asylum-seeking students and students under the Temporary Protection Directive were entitled to a lowered tuition fee. The UC received the [evaluation](#) of this one-year-old regulation, and the evaluation did not contain any surprising findings. The UC did however question whether already enrolled students, who then apply for asylum, also fall under this regulation, but for those an individual solution will be sought through student services. The UC thinks this is a great example of the high level of individual care our university gives to its students, and the [UC fully supports](#) the intended decision to extend this regulation for another year.
