Roadmap - optimalisation project

Persons provisioning integration for Mobility-Online

Mobility-Online is used for multiple different exchange processes (Courses abroad, Internship, Graduation, etc.) and these processes have different needs for personal data.

Mobility-Online must be fed with personal data for UT-employees that either need an account in Mobility-Online or that need to be selected in drop-down boxes etc. (supervisors, etc.).

These so called Persons are objects in Mobility-Online (so they are not accounts/users!). In this case it concerns persons who have the function 'UT supervisor'.

In the current situation, these persons are manually imported into Mobility Online. For this purpose, a selection is made in AFAS based on the relevant employees (namely those who must have the function UT supervisor in mobility processes). In the near future this selection will be imported and maintained automatically by the new interface.

And also employees who work in Mobility Online have user accounts. Within this interface the account will be disabled if the user is not an employee anymore.

Next to these functionalities, the UT Department structure will also be transferred and maintained through the interface.

Let's talk: Terminology

Travel insurance: All students who register their mobility abroad in Mobility Online are automatically registered for free travel insurance upon approval of their course list/ proposal form. They receive an email confirmation of the registration, a digital insurance policy and a link to the Insurance website for more detailed information. The UT travel insurance applies to study-related activities only and only has basic coverage. Students must always be aware of the official travel advice issued by the Dutch Government. The Ministry of Foreign Affairs publishes an overview of all recent official travel recommendations. Only students traveling to countries that are considered safe (indicated green or yellow) are allowed to travel and will receive a travel insurance.
