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Trajectory Overview

The SUEQ consists of three main parts:



Module 1 Quality Assurance and Safeguarding

Themes: framework for and tasks and responsibilities of those involved in the assurance and safe-guarding of assessment quality at institution and programme level. Accreditation requirements. Assessment vision and policy. Field of influence. New developments.



Module 2 Quality of Assessment

Themes: judging the quality of assessments. Ways to promote, establish and guarantee the quality of assessments on course level. Ways to ensure the quality of (graduation) projects and to guarantee the achievement of the final qualifications.



Module 3 in-depth study and advise

Practice-oriented exploration of an area of interest or a problem within one's own study pro-gramme (or broader), resulting in a concrete, expertly drafted, convincing, peer-reviewed (written) advice, addressed to a relevant official or committee.
