UNIVERSITY OF TWENTE POLICY ON OPEN ACCESS

All UT-affiliated scholarly publications must become Open Access (OA), preferably immediately with a licence for reuse, but at the latest six months after their first online publication date.

Authors who are affiliated with the University of Twente:

- Must make sure that the final pdf of all their publications is uploaded to <u>Pure</u>.
- Must make all their UT-affiliated publications OA, preferably immediately with a licence for reuse, but at the latest 6 months after the first online publication date.
- Preferably publish in high-quality OA journals that are listed in the Directory of Open Access Journals (<u>DOAJ</u>), and in the almost 10.000 journals that let submitting UT authors publish OA at a 100% discount. These journals can be found in the <u>UT Journal Browser</u>.
- Use possible funds from their research funder to publish OA immediately with a reuse licence outside of the agreements for a 100% discount.

To support this UT-wide, the University Library will:

- Make the final published pdf of UT-affiliated articles, conference papers, and chapters in edited collections in UT Research Information openly available six months after the first publication date, based on Article 25fa of the Dutch Copyright Act. Eligible publications in UT Research Information will automatically become open without a licence for reuse after six months, unless a UT author opts out for one or more publications.
- Continue the current agreements between the Universities of The Netherlands (UNL) and publishers that let submitting UT authors publish OA at a 100% discount in almost 10.000 scholarly journals.
- Support the faculties (see below).

The faculty boards will:

- Supported by the information specialists and the specialist open access from the University Library, determine what specific extra support is needed in the faculty to stimulate immediate OA publishing.
- Finance the OA support in their faculty, as they currently do with the UNL agreements for 100% discount.
- Stimulate the recognition and rewards of OA publications and initiatives within the faculty.
