

Directive for passing candidates for the Bachelor's examination
(applicable only to students whose first enrolment for the programme
was before September 1, 2013)

A candidate is passed the Bachelor's examination of the Creative
Technology programme if he meets the following 8 conditions.

A (general conditions on results for interim examinations and tests).

1. The candidate has either an exemption or an assessment outcome (i.e. a mark on a 1-10 scale or a "pass/fail") for each unit of study of the programme;
2. All of the candidate's marks for units of study of the programme are 5 or higher;
3. There is no unit of study for which the final assessment of the candidate resulted in a fail (NVD);
4. The candidate has been awarded a mark 6 or higher for all units of study with a study load of 10EC or more.

B (conditions specific for the marks of the first year of the programme).

5. The candidate may have a mark 5 for a unit of study of the first year, but only a single one.
6. If the candidate's list of marks for the first year's units of study shows a single 5, there must be at least one other first year's unit of study for which the candidate has been awarded a mark 7 or higher; the study load of this compensating unit must be at least as high as the load of the unit with the mark 5.

C (conditions specific for the marks of the programme of years 2 and 3).

7. The candidate may have a mark 5 for a unit of study in the programme after the first year, but only a single one;
8. A possible (single) 5 for a unit in this study phase must be compensated by a mark 7 or higher for a unit of study with the same or a higher study load in this study phase, in the same way as described in item 6 for the first year.

In every other case the candidate will NOT be passed.
