UT LECTURE EUROPEAN INTEGRATION AND ITS LIMITS.
INTERGOVERNMENTAL CONFLICTS AND THEIR DOMESTIC ORIGINS

European integration has made major steps in the last two decades culminating in the Lisbon treaty, but there were also strong debates among member states on constitutional issues.

In the next lecture organized by the Centre for the Study of Democracy, Daniel Finke (University of Heidelberg) will present the main findings of his forthcoming book on the conflicts at the intergovernmental summits and their domestic origins. His book explains how governments solved Europe's constitutional quandary between legitimacy, efficiency and integration and clarifies why governments agreed to reform projects that they had previously rejected.

The lecture takes place on Wednesday, 7 October, 16.00 – 17.15 in the Institutenweg 25, room 10. The talk is free of charge and will be in English.
