

Advice on EER 2017 - 2018

Advice on the central part of the EER:

The Educational Committee of EPA advises:

- (1) That next year, the Educational Committee is given the EER in time (March 2018) in order to give proper advice.
- (2) To make sure the distinction between tests and components is clear in the EER text. Define terms properly and use them consistently.
- (3) To make sure that the meaning of the English and Dutch version of the ERR is identical.
- (4) To keep the BSA requirements (article 6.3) on three modules (45 EC) rather than on the new suggested study load.

Advice on the program specific part of the EER:

The Educational Committee of EPA advises:

- (1) To define a test as a component.
- (2) To be flexible with the application of the BSA.
- (3) To consider giving a positive study advice to students who have successfully completed 75% of the Study load with the addition, that at least 2 full modules have been successfully completed.
- (4) To give a positive study advice to students who have successfully completed 3 full modules or more.
- (5) To specify in the EER that students need to have obtained at least 90 ECs, including the full first year, before they can start their internship, exchange or Bachelor thesis.
- (6) To allow for flexibility, if external circumstances make the Programme Management want to change components of a Module (as specified in article 4.7b). The EER now sets descriptions of module components in stone, a long time before the module is being taught.
