Allow me to present myself with a few words on why I would appreciate your vote for me for joining the Faculty Council again and on my work.

I have already been member of the MB-FR from 2009 to 2015. Now, after a short break for completing a bigger research project, I would like to engage again by representing research and education from an interdisciplinary, a staff, and an international perspective. I've seen many universities and other non-university research institutes, projects, and educational programmes (some of which I was involved building or transforming). Some of my spare time I spend as member of the Supervisory Board of an housing association (Spar- und Bauverein eG Dortmund), with €384m total assets and €102m saving deposits in 2015; but also play jazz music, support Syrian refugees, and mostly enjoy being father of my 3 year old twins Henri and Paul.
