1. ABOUT THE NEWSLETTER/FROM YOUR NEWSLETTER EDITOR

Nevertheless I noted some items where the synchronisation could be better; a particular specimen of poor planning is the coincidence of the 6th International IACIS conference in Hakone with the 195th ACS meeting in Toronto. Hence: please keep me posted and do so well in advance, even if the plans are only provisional. See also my note on conferences under "IACIS news". Apart from the cover, we have a new department viz. the first position wanted advertisement (See under item 8). Is this going to become more regular?

function better as an association with personal membership and to ensure adequate representation in Council for "industry", "academia" and different parts of the world. It is also now our experience that it is virtually impossible to gather more than a small fraction of the Council in its present form to discuss IACIS matters except at the international meetings so that a more flexible way of handling the matters of IACIS is required.

Based on the suggestions by the working party and discussions at the IUPAC meeting in Boston in August 1987, it is obvious that fairly extensive changes of the statutes are warranted. These should be approved of by the membership through ballot and therefore will require quite detailed preparation. Briefly, we intend to suggest changes along the following lines:

(1) A standing committee of the Council should take over most of the short-term decisions on IACIS matters. This committee would consist of the president, the president-elect, the immediate past president and the secretary. Such a standing committee presumably would be able to meet more frequently than Council.

(ii) The Council would meet at the international conferences. Half of the council would retire every two years. New members would partially be nominated and elected by the IACIS members, partially elected by Council.

(iii) Local organisations would be able to join IACIS as corporate members. They would be represented at Council through appointed Council members.

(iv) The IACIS would be held together above all through the Newsletter. We would therefore have to find possibilities to finance (at least) biannual publication of the Newsletter. In addition to personal membership fees this would perhaps be managed through (small) contributions from corporate members or companies.

(v) A separate account would be set up in Budapest into which members from East Europe would be able to pay their membership fees.

If changes along these lines are approved of, it will imply that IACIS becomes Douglas Everett to consider what could be done to make it possible for IACIS to

## 3. IACIS NEWS

### 3.1 President's Message

We are working on the details of these changes and the modifications of the

statutes that are required. These will be put forward to you for approval.

Meanwhile, I would greatly appreciate any comments that you may have.

As a first extension of the present Council, we've asked the European Colloid and Interface Society to appoint a member as an observer. It is my pleasure to announce that the ECIS has appointed professor Heinz Hoffmann.

The next international meeting in Hakone is approaching rapidly. I hope to see as many as possible of you there!

### 3.3 Future IACIS International Conferences

It has now been decided that after the meeting in Hakone, June 1988, the 7th International Conference on Colloid and Interface Science will take place in France in 1991, probably in July. The 8th Conference in this series is scheduled for 1994 in Australia.

### 3.4 A remark on the European Conference Circuit

Sometimes people complain about the many meetings that take place and about the lack of insight into the organizations behind them. Let me briefly review the European part of this circuit emphasizing IACIS' role in it. From bottom to top we have the following types of conferences.

a) Local meetings. Restricted to a limited number of people, usually in the local language and of a short duration. These meetings are as a rule not recorded in the NL.

b) Local meetings with international participation. Responsibility is fully with the local organizing committees and/or groups. "Local" may also refer to a group of countries (Iberian, Scandinavian). Such meetings can be mentioned in the NL, provided the information is available in time and the topic belongs to "interface and colloid science".

c) Meetings under IACIS sponsorship are particularly emphasized.

d) Meetings of the "European Chemistry at Interfaces Conferences" are also automatically recorded, because this organization pursues in many respects the same goals as IACIS, though on a smaller scale. (Further information: biannual meetings, alternating between West and East Europe, in a Gordon-Conference style atmosphere.)

The next one, nr. 10, will be in San Benedetto, Italy, see this NL, item 6.20; and the 11th in the German Democratic Republic in 1990, see this NL 6.88. At present, your Newsletter Editor is also chairman of the Standing Committee, consisting of about 10-12 representatives from all over Europe.)
