

UNIVERSITY OF TWENTE'S POLICY ON OPEN ACCESS TO RESEARCH RESULTS

To increase Open Access (OA) to the university's research results, authors who are affiliated with the University of Twente:

1. **are stimulated to publish their research results in a high-quality OA journal** that is listed in the [Directory of Open Access Journals](#).

Corresponding authors are encouraged to apply for a reimbursement from the university's [Open Science Fund](#). If the publication meets the criteria, the University of Twente will reimburse half or all of the publication costs, depending on the impact factor of the journal, with a maximum of €750 and €1500.

2. **must upload the final pdf of all their publications to the university's [research information system](#)**

This makes the university's publications sustainably available in the National Library of the Netherlands, and more visible because widely used search engines will now find them in the portal University of Twente Research Information.

3. **are strongly encouraged to also upload the accepted author manuscript of their non-OA publications (closed publications in subscription journals)**

That is the final full-text version after changes based on peer review and editorial comments, but without the layout of the publisher. When a publication is not OA, the University Library is only allowed to make this version openly available, possibly after an embargo period.
