



## How to correctly enter a conference contribution in Pure

In Pure there are multiple ways to enter a contribution to a conference. It is however important to note that the type you choose has an impact on how the entered publication is counted in an evaluation such as SEP. Keeping this in mind we recommend the following steps:


1. Is your contribution published in a book? Please use the Chapter in Book/Report/Conference proceeding -> Conference contribution publication type. This will mark the publication as scientific output for SEP.




2. Is your contribution published in a journal? Please use the Contribution to Journal -> Conference article publication type. This will mark the publication as scientific output for SEP.




3. A conference contribution <u>always</u> needs a host publication (mandatory field) and is linked to an event. No matter if it's an article, chapter or contribution to conference type, always click the "add event button" and find or enter the relevant conference.






4. Is your contribution not published in a journal or book, but still a paper, poster or abstract, then use the corresponding *contribution to conference* publication type.



5. If you've presented at a conference, this should be entered in Pure as an activity; Talk or presentation → Invited talk or Oral presentation


The accompanying paper can be submitted as research output. (see no. 3)





6. If you attended a conference (visitor) or contributed in the organization of a conference this should be entered in Pure as an Activity;
