#### 1. Opening and Determining agenda

#### 2. Announcement PD

- 1. Various discussions are happening at different levels of a university's computer science discipline, including education and research. #### 5. New Year's event

#### 8. QAI

- 1. Internet of Things (Krystof/Mohammed)
  - a. Summary of the interview
    - i. Teacher tried a new approach called blending learning, which did not go as intended and resulted in decreased motivation among the students.

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- ii. Students were missing out on in-person lectures because lectures were being recorded and provided online. The teacher was recommended to have more live in-person lectures.
- iii. There were no final exams, and the teacher was recommended to go back to traditional assessments.
- iv. Teacher was advised to provide a list of prepared topics for the project, to have guest lectures from industry professionals, and to emphasize practical projects.
- b. Zaytsev had a couple of comments:
  - i. Students do not necessarily want in-person lectures, but rather contact hours, guidance, and a personalized experience.
  - ii. Live lectures can work well, but there needs to be some other activity that involves student interaction and guidance.
  - iii. Teachers can always reach out to education learning and e-learning specialists from UT.
- 2. Limits to Computing (Daniël/Anna)
  - a. Summary of the interview
    - i. The course scored an average of 9.3, which was surprisingly high but understandable because the course is optional for both mathematics and computer science students who have a genuine interest in the material.
    - ii. The teacher gave the students a lot of freedom and the material was engaging, which resulted in high student engagement.
