The Events & Community Engagement working group is responsible for designing and organizing these activities.

Tasks and responsibilities

As a member of this working group, you:

- Contribute to the development of relevant and engaging events by:
 - proposing ideas
 - bringing in input from the community
- Support the preparation of events, which may include:
 - identifying and inviting speakers
 - preparing presentations or session formats
 - contributing content for event promotion (in collaboration with the Communication & Media team)
- Contribute to the execution of events, for example by:
 - moderating sessions or discussions
 - presenting or facilitating exchanges
 - acting as a host during events and ensuring an inclusive atmosphere
 - collecting feedback to improve future activities

Collaboration and time commitment

The working group is coordinated by the Events & Community Engagement Co-Chair, who oversees the event calendar and supports alignment across activities.
