Enrolment regulation University of Twente 2020 – 2021

The Executive Board has made some changes to the 'Enrolment Regulation of the University of Twente 2020-2021'. After reading it, the University Council agreed that most of the changes were a good adjustment to the already existing policy. However, on a technical note, the Council would like to see an addition to chapter 2.5.3.6. Here the tuition paid by students, who do a joint or double degree, is discussed but the case where students do not pay tuition fee at our partner University is not addressed. Just before the plenary meeting on September 25th 2019, the University Council received the request of the Board for an addendum of the regulation. This addendum should create a pilot for charging an admission fee for enrolment of master programmes of the faculty of EEMCS for non-EU students. This fee should distract students with non-EU diploma's to apply as an overwhelming majority of these do not lead to final admission and actual study. The University Council, in the meeting deferred this decision to the Presidium. The Presidium decided that a pilot with an application fee for master programmes of the faculty of EEMCS can be started as long as the distinction between students that have to pay a fee and those who do not is in accordance with Dutch and European law. The advice of the EEMCS faculty council is generally positive about a one-year pilot for an application fee for Master students at this faculty.
